Renting a Home

Renting requires making regular payments.

 You are essentially paying a fee to reside in a dwelling for as long as you live there.



The lease is a critical legal document, which needs to be read carefully before signing.

- Details set out in a lease can include:
 - Rental payments (usually monthly)
 - The length of the contract (usually one year)
 - Terms of renewal to keep living there
 - Deposits (to cover any damage to the property)
 - Maintenance commitments of the landlord

Landlord and Tenant legislation covers most people living in rental housing.

- Legislation varies by province and governs landlord and tenant relations.
